Programme Specific Eligibility Criteria – DAFI

In addition to the Selection Priorities outlined in the WTI Scholarship Policy (2020), DAFI scholars must also meet the following minimum criteria and conditions:

Academic ability:

One of the primary selection criteria used is the student's academic performance, or his/her school leaving certificate (originals) with excellent marks.

Status:

A candidate must have the legal status of a recognised refugee in the Sudan

Gender:

One of the main global education strategies and UNHCR policy priorities is to increase the number of girls attending primary and post-primary education. Supporting this policy, DAFI scholarships should be used to increase the equal participation of female students in tertiary education. A Sudanese Leaving Certificate grade of 60% is required for females, while 65% is required for males.

Distribution:

In order to allocate benefits in an equitable manner to as many refugee families as possible, no more than one scholarship will be provided to a single family.

Financial Need:

Applicants should be able to demonstrate financial need. They will be requested to submit personal statements showing the financial status of their families and their capacity to support them in continuing their studies.

Age:

Applicants must be a maximum of 28 years old at the beginning of the proposed academic study.
